International Workers Memorial Day

Hazards Campaigner Tommy Harte brought International Workers Memorial Day to the UK in the 1990s from trade unions in Canada and USA. It is commemorated throughout the world, in thousands of events involving millions of people and is recognised by dozens of countries including the UK Government in 2009.

The purple forget-me-knot ribbon symbolises remembering our dead. GMHC/Hazards Campaign promotes and resources IWMD which is commemorated across the UK from Aberdeen to Penzance. On IWMD we tell the Whole Story of workplace harm. Every year in the UK > 50,000 people die from work related incidents and illnesses.

That is around 140 people dying from work per day or one person every 10 minutes in GB. The UN ILO estimates 2.78 million people worldwide dying from work every year or 1 person every 11 seconds worldwide. <http://www.hazardscampaign.org.uk/?s=the+whole+story>

Was set up in 2006, by GMHC Hilda Palmer after years of working with bereaved families, because 'employers failure to comply with health and safety laws killed people we love, our stories show the need for strong health and safety law, strictly enforced'. It was set up for a fight for justice for all families and for safer workplaces for everyone. FACK directly supports families at inquests, trials and in the investigation process.

Louise Taggart in this year's FACK statement for #IWMD18 said 'We know that no-one lives forever. But, work should be life-changing in a positive way. It should never ever be life-ending.'
