Types of reportable injury

- **The death of any person**
- All deaths to workers and non-workers, ***with the exception of suicides***, must be reported if they arise from a work-related accident, including an act of physical violence to a worker.

What's the point?

Work-related suicides are not reportable. They are not counted. They are not a workplace prevention priority.

They should be. Suicides caused by bad jobs are a real and growing problem at work.

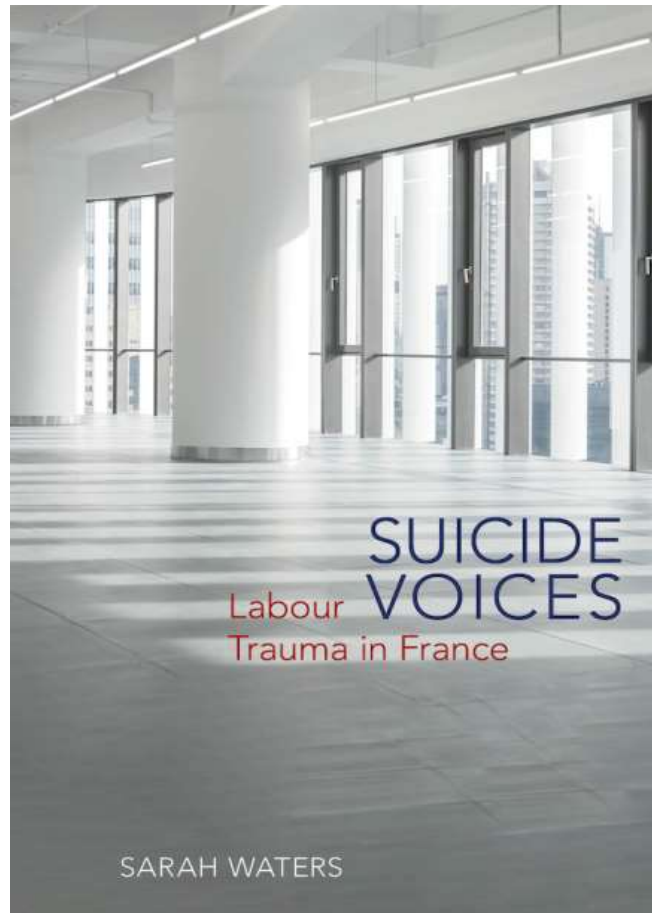
